Funeral Services At Trinity For Dr. Mildred Wagner

Funeral services were conducted Saturday at Trinity United Methodist church, Piedmont, for Mildred S. Wagner, M.D., 59, 104 Kalbaugh Street, Westernport, Md., who was dead on arrival Wednesday at Potomac Valley Hospital, Keyser. The Rev. Curtis Saville officiated and burial was in Rocky Gap Veterans Cemetery.

Boal Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

Dr. Wagner practiced general family medicine in Westernport from 1956 until her retirement several years ago.

Born in Hamilton, Pa., she was a daughter of Mrs. Esther (Hamilton) Sheesley, Cumberland, Md. and the late Rev. Joseph P. Sheesley.

Following graduation from Freeburg, Pa. High School, Dr. Wagner took pre-medical studies at Bucknell University in Lewisburg, Pa. She attended Hahnemann Hospital Medical School in Philadelphia for two years and received her medical degree in family practice from the University of Virginia School of Medicine, Charlottesville in 1955.

After returning to Philadelphia to complete her internship at Presbyterian Hospital, Dr. Wagner practiced general family medicine in Fishersville, Va.; King's Daughter's Hospital in Staunton, Va. and the Community Hospital in Waynesboro, Va.

She set up a temporary office in the office of Dr. Paul Wilson, Ashfield Street, Piedmont, before opening her own office in the Union

Building in Westernport.

She was a member of Trinity United Methodist Church and was a life member of the Westernport Parent-Teacher Association.

Dr. Wagner was a former district vice-president for Region 1 of the Allegany County Council of Parent-Teacher Associations and served as health chairman of that organization. She was a past president of the Westernport Elementary School PTA and had served as president of the Bruce High School PTSA.

In her capacity as health chairman, Dr. Wagner took part in an award-winning play presented jointly by the American Lung Association and the County PTA Council to encourage non-smoking among students.

In addition to her mother, she is survived by her husband, George "Bill" Wagner; four sons, Albert Wagner and George Wagner, both of Blacksburg, Va.; John Wagner, Charlottesville, Va. and James Wagner, at home; one brother, Dwight Sheesley, Glen Burnie, Md.; three sisters, Ella Mae Holmes, Los Angeles, Calif.; Mrs. Janet Crowe, Cumberland and Mrs. Belva Michaels, Harrisonburg, Va. Another brother, Ira Joe Sheesley, died August 9, 1984.
